FAMILY REUNIFICATION

Between 2014 and 2022, IOM Slovenia helped over 50 families and worked with over fifteen IOM offices around the globe to enable them to reunite with their family members in Slovenia.

Family reunification constitutes one of the pathways with the greatest potential to contribute to regular and orderly migration in the EU.

Continuously implemented since 2013, IOM assists eligible beneficiaries of international protection in Slovenia with family reunification procedures and helps families navigate the often complex family reunification procedures so they can arrive safely and with the necessary support.

IOM IN SLOVENIA

Established in 1951, IOM is the leading intergovernmental organization in the field of migration.

The IOM Office in Slovenia operates under the Agreement on Cooperation signed with the Government of the Republic of Slovenia in 2001. It covers different areas of intervention, such as movement assistance (refugee resettlement and relocation, family reunification), facilitating social cohesion, protection of children, counter-trafficking and migration health.
